# 2023-2024 by the Numbers

#### 316 Students Served



Rothenberg Students visited the Garden throughout the year with an average of 13 hours spent per year per child, with Pre-School students receiving 16 hours per student. Additionally, 10 students participated in our two-week paid Summer Internship. In all, students spent over 5,000 hours in programming instruction.



#### 430 Volunteer Hours

Core volunteers contributed 200 hours to help in the garden while MadTree Brewing volunteers helped in the spring and fall for 160 hours. Students from Mariemont Jr. High contributed 70 hours.



## 15 Parent/Guardian Helpers

Throughout the year 15 parents/guardians participated in our monthly program preparing food and cooking.



## **Community Partners**

Special programs from community partners like the ABC Activities Beyond The Classroom, Civic Garden Center, Gorman Farms, Hamilton County R3Source, Madtree Brewing, Ohio School on Falconry, 1% for the Planet, Our Harvest Cooperative, Slow Food Cincinnati, and Western Hills Garden Club were brought in for our students and teachers.



### Teacher Satisfaction

At the end of the year, teachers were surveyed to outstanding results:

- 100% of teachers rated the garden instruction as "Excellent"
- 100% of teachers would like to participate in the garden program in the future
- Teachers saw the garden program as enrichment for their core subjects:
  - 100% in Science
  - '/0% in Math

- 60% in ELA
- 60% in Social Studies
